



The bridge on the Appalachian Trail over the Duell Hollow Brook is officially closed due to structural damage.

The National Park Service will be replacing the bridge but not until 2021.

For now the official route of the Appalachian Trail will include a road walk down Hoyt Rd to Route 55 and then walk up Duell Hollow Rd. (all in Wingdale, NY) to rejoin the trail.





Chapter 139. Vehicles, Unregistered

Article I. Storage

§ 139-1. Permitted areas.

No unregistered motor vehicle which is unfit for use or disabled or significantly dismantled or inoperable shall be stored, parked or placed upon property within the Town of Dover unless such motor vehicle shall be within a garage or other appropriate building or within areas maintained by licensed junk dealers or motor vehicle dealers.

§ 139-2. Penalties for offenses.

For any violation of this article, the owners of the property where the motor vehicle is located shall be fined not less than \$10 nor more than \$20 for each offense. Each such vehicle shall be deemed a separate offense. Each day that any violation continues shall constitute a separate violation.

§ 139-3. Property owned by more than one person.

If there is more than one owner of the property where such vehicle is located, the owners shall be separately liable.
